Theme: African Philanthropy at an Inflection Point

Thematic Areas

The conference theme, "African Philanthropy at an Inflection Point," is structured into four sub-themes that enable inclusive dialogue and participation:

People

The People dimension of philanthropy in Africa is experiencing significant inflection points. We invite abstracts that explore the emergence of new actors in philanthropy, including impact investors, social entrepreneurs, corporate social responsibility programmes, sports personalities, artists, diaspora, and high-net-worth individuals. Additionally, abstracts focusing on pan-African and feminist philanthropies and the role of youth in shaping philanthropy in Africa are welcomed.

Power

The Power dimension encompasses the distribution and exercise of power within the sector. We encourage abstracts that delve into power dynamics and local ownership, philanthropy's contribution to system change, and the potential for cooperation between African philanthropies and international actors.

Practice

The Practice dimension reflects the strategies, methods, and tools employed by philanthropic organisations. We seek abstracts that showcase innovative technology for resource mobilisation, explore the evolution of faith-based and traditional philanthropy, and highlight the strength of community philanthropy in driving local development.

Policy

The Policy dimension relates to the regulatory and institutional frameworks that shape the sector. We invite abstracts that examine regulatory frameworks, explore new financing models, and emphasise the importance of governance and leadership in the philanthropic sector.

Submission Guidelines

We encourage members, partners, and stakeholders to submit abstracts that align with the conference's theme and thematic areas. The abstracts should not exceed 250 words and should include a clear title and a concise description of the session. Please indicate the preferred format(s) for your session, prioritizing informative and interactive approaches. Submissions should be in English and include the name(s), affiliation(s), and contact information of the presenter(s).

We look forward to receiving your abstracts and the opportunity to showcase diverse and inspiring sessions at the African Philanthropy Conference. Together, let us shape the future of philanthropy in Africa and inspire shared learning among philanthropic practitioners and stakeholders.

Criteria for Session Proposals

When submitting your session proposal, please adhere to the following criteria: Title: The titles of the sessions were suggested to reflect the ideas illustrated by the subtheme's description. Please feel free to propose alternatives that clearly convey the essence of your session and capture participants' attention.

Description: Provide a concise and informative description of your session. Clearly outline the objectives, key topics, and expected outcomes. Emphasize the innovative and non-conventional approaches that your session will showcase.

Format: Select the most suitable format(s) for your session. Aim for interactivity and engagement with the audience. Consider incorporating panel discussions, workshops, case studies, interactive presentations, or other dynamic formats that encourage dialogue and exchange of ideas.

Relevance: Ensure that your session aligns with the conference theme of "African Philanthropy at an Inflection Point" and relates to one or more of the identified thematic areas: People, Power, Practice, and Policy. Clearly articulate the connections between your session and the broader conference objectives.

Innovation: Highlight the innovative aspects of your session. Share how your approach, methodologies, or practices differ from traditional philanthropic approaches and how they contribute to advancing philanthropy in Africa.

Learning Outcomes: Clearly state the expected learning outcomes for participants. Describe how your session will inspire shared learning, foster new perspectives, and provide practical insights that can be applied in the field of philanthropy.

Presenter Information: Include the names, affiliations, and contact information of the presenter(s). Briefly outline their expertise and experience in the field of philanthropy or related areas.
